

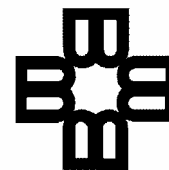

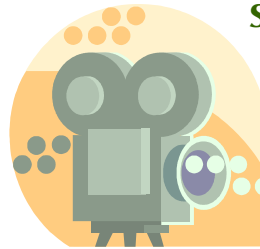

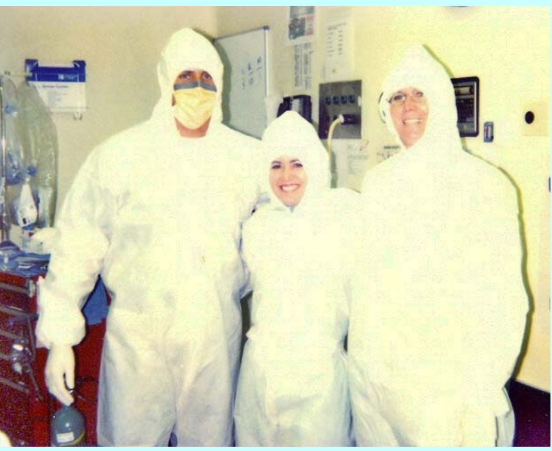


Roger Gallagher, BS, CRNA
